# Waterfowl Area



**E**noree River Waterfowl Management Area was established in the late 1970's in Newberry County. It was begun as a mitigation project by SCE&G when the Parr Reservoir dam was raised to enlarge Parr Reservoir. The land is owned by the U.S. Forest Service. Both the U.S. Forest Service and the South Carolina Department of Natural Resources manage it cooperatively.

Subers Creek is used to flood the 50-acre impoundment. The area is a combination of open field agriculture and flooded hardwood forest. Open areas are planted in corn and millet. The waterfowl area is a category 2 waterfowl area open for duck hunting on Saturdays until 11:00 a.m. A WMA permit is required to hunt. Check in is required through a self-permitting check station located at the entrance to the waterfowl area. Hunters must be in possession of the permit and it must be filled out and returned before leaving the area.

Wood duck, ring-neck duck and green-winged teal are the main ducks harvested on the Enoree River Waterfowl Management Area.

Other wildlife-related activities include bird watching, deer hunting and small game hunting on USFS property dedicated as WMAs. Many bird species visit the area and mammals such as deer, beaver, raccoon and squirrel may be observed.
